With a team of more than 6,500 volunteers worldwide, the organisation has conducted more than 230 events on 6 continents.



Her passion for inspiring others to follow her footsteps as an engineer is also coupled with companies she has created to fulfil other interests. She is also an owner of a Brussels-based luxury wellness centre on Avenue Louise and is driving its growth by 25% each year to prepare for its international expansion.

Melissa uses all these professional backgrounds and experiences to bring **Strategic Design** to the forefront in companies and to show how the design process and tools can be used to infuse the culture with creativity to transform new ways, products and services for the future. She uses the intersection of design, business & technology to develop impactful experiences for employees, customers, business partners & suppliers. She has the opportunity to train and encourage executives to do the same as she leads a Global Executive Masters Degree in Strategic Design & Management at Parsons School of Design in Paris, NYC and Shanghai.
